Swim School

Swim School will be operating for 2 weeks from **Monday 21st November to Friday 2nd December**. Infants and Primary students will each attend a one week intensive swimming program. In the past, students have participated in a two week program, however due to student numbers, this year students will have access to five full days at the pool, rather than 10 half days.

Kinder and Year 1 - Learn to Swim

Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday of the first week (November 21st-23rd)
and Monday, Tuesday of the second week (November 28th-29th)

Year 2-6 - Stroke Correction and Water Safety

Thursday, Friday of the first week (November 24th-25th)
and Wednesday, Thursday and Friday of the second week (November 30th – December 2nd)

On the days that your child is not attending swim school, they are expected to attend school where normal classes will be running.

Permission notes were sent home on Friday.

Please return them back to school by Wednesday 16th November.

3D Printer Demonstration

On Friday next week, Mr Harvey and Mr Vangelatos from Cobar Public School are demonstrating for us how a 3D Printer works.

We will be learning how to make a virtual design of an object using computer technology and then watching it print out in 3D form.

3D printing is a relatively new technology with the capability to print very complex things - from puzzles, to working robots. We aren't quite at the skill level to be designing and creating a robot, but we are excited to see how our own designs on the computer can be reproduced into something we can actually hold and use.
